I am happy and proud when I saw that many people came to celebrate with us in the Karen's New Year. I hope next year is better than this year.

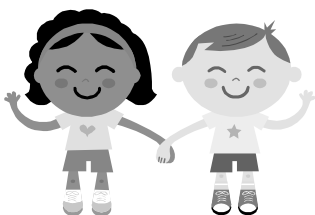
